



I am so thrilled to hear that these last tests come along with Correction papers! This is excellent news and so Up To Date!



# **EXAM ANSWER SHEETS**

Dear Colleagues,

We are very glad to share with you that as from the November/ December 2022 exam session, we will be implementing a new optical recognition marking system for the national examinations which will require that students transfer their answers to an answer sheet. Not only will this enable us to issue results faster but also, obtain valuable statistic information about the answers of each item of the exam.

In order to provide students with training in transferring their answers, the third and fourth round of tests will include sample answer sheets, similar to the ones they will have to complete on the day of the exam. Writing tasks will continue to be marked in the traditional way, by a team of examiners.

We advise candidates to do the exercises on the question paper, using the strategies developed during the course and then, transfer their answers to the answer sheet provided. Both documents (the question paper and the answer sheet) will be taken into account during the marking period, in this first stage of the new system implementation.

Those candidates that require an accommodated format of their test due to special educational needs (Adecuaciones curriculares) will not need to transfer their answers and their question paper will be marked in the traditional way.

The new system will be used for the following levels:

Juniors 3 to 5 Adults 1 to 4 Modules 1 to 6 Oxford House

# **ELEMENTARY LEVEL**

# HINTS ON THE ORAL EVALUATIONS

New Happy Earth 2 / Today 2 / Wider World 1

**Total timing:** +/- 8 minutes - **Total parts:** 2

PART 1 - Presentation of the TOPIC: about 4 minutes.

We expect Children III / Juniors II students to speak freely about one of the following topics:

- My favourite place in Uruguay
- My last birthday / A birthday I enjoyed
- An important person in my life
- My favourite free time activity or activities



Ask students to bring photos or drawings to illustrate what they are going to talk about. They should produce a project on a soft piece of cardboard, PowerPoint presentation or they can bring an object instead if they feel like it. Remember that the students are not expected to recite a text by heart but to hold a communicative and natural conversation with the examiner. It would be great if the students were able to ask questions to the examiner as well.

### PART 2 – Picture description: about 4 minutes.

Students are presented with a picture or a set of pictures. They might be asked to describe the scene, or the sequence using different verb tenses according to the instructions. For example, if the picture shows a girl in different moments of her day, the examiner might say "This is Lucy. This is what she does on a typical day, tell me about her routine." If the examiner wanted to test simple past, he might say "This is Lucy. Tell me about what she did yesterday." Similarly, the examiner might ask the student to talk about Lucy's plans for the weekend, for example. In order to obtain a more complete sample of the candidate's language, the examiner can also ask further questions such as:

- Where is/was Lucy?
- What's the weather like?
- How many (animals) can you see?
- What is she doing/eating/wearing/etc. in this picture?
- Where's the (book)?

- What colour is the (sofa)?
- Has Lucy got short or long hair?
- Is Lucy taller than her friend?
- Look at this picture, where did she go after school?



Make sure you provide students with plenty of practice in describing pictures. Remind them of the importance of listening carefully to the examiner's instructions and questions so as to know what verb tense to use in their answers (e.g. What did Lucy do yesterday? or What does Lucy do every day?). Students should also practise the use of connectors and sequencers such as First, Then, After that and Finally.

- ♣ What does she have for breakfast? What about you?
- ♣ How does she get to school?
- ♣ What time does she start school?
- **♣** Do **you** go to school in the morning?

- What is Tom wearing?
- ♣ What colour is Tom's wardrobe?
- ♣ Does Tom play a musical instrument?
- ♣ Where is Tom´s bag? And the ball?
- Why is Dad not happy? / Is Tom's bedroom tidy?



- This is Pam and this is Carol. They are friends.
- Where did they go last Saturday?
- What did they eat?
- Look at Carol. What is she wearing in this picture?
- ♣ Look at the man and the woman? What are they doing in this picture?

- Apart from football, what do you think is the most popular sport in the world?
- When was the last time you went to the gym?
- Why do you think many people don't do any exercise?

# Social networking

- What social networking sites do you use more frequently? Why?
- What are some good points about social networking?
- What kind of information do you feel comfortable sharing on social networks?
- Do your parents use social networking sites? How do you feel about it?

Stage 2 +/- 5 minutes

### Interlocutor

"Now, I'm going to give each of you a task sheet with the same question but with different options to talk about. You will have to talk on your own for about a minute and also answer a question after your partner has talked.

Here you are. (Interlocutor hands out the task sheets)

You are going to talk about wishes. Imagine you or your family won the big prize in the lottery, what would you do with the money?

Choose 2 or 3 from the ideas in the box to talk about. Add other ideas of your own if you wish. You can make notes while you think about what you are going to say."

(Interlocutor hands in paper and pencil)

"Here you are. You have one minute to prepare the task."

Stage 3 3 minutes

## Interlocutor

"Now, I'd like you to exchange opinions for about three minutes. I'm just going to listen to your discussion."

(Place Stage 3 task sheet where both candidates can see it.)

You and your partner are members of the youth club of your school. The club wants to advertise a party for club members to raise money.

Talk about the best things that you can do to advertise the party.

You need to decide:

- Make a poster for the school
- Use Facebook
- Phone call to the members
- Pay for a radio advert
- Send a printed invitation to members
- Other

Talk to each other about the items mentioned in the box and decide what the best options are.

Allow candidates to discuss these issues for about 3 minutes. Intervene as little as possible, only if communication breaks down or if candidates have not understood the task.

After 3 minutes (aprox) -

Interlocutor – Thank you (Interlocutor retrieves task sheets)

Stage 4 3 minutes

## Interlocutor:

Select any of the following questions as appropriate - You can ask any other questions related to the topic "Entertainment"

- Have you ever organized a party? What different aspects do you need to consider?
- What do you think is the most difficult aspect to agree on with friends when organizing a party?
- What do you usually do for fun on a Saturday evening?
- What can you do with friends to have fun without spending any money?
- What is the perfect plan for an evening at home?
- What do you enjoy doing with your family?
- Do you like going to parties with a friend or going on your own and meeting new people?

# OXFORD HOUSE PRELIMINARY ACTIVATE B1+ SPEAKING AND LISTENING EXAM

**FORMAT and PROCEDURE:** Students are examined in pairs and the length of the interview is 14 minutes.

Part 1. Greetings, setting at ease and giving personal and factual information about themselves - 3 minutes

After the examiner greets the students and introduces himself, he/she asks the students personal questions in turn.

## Part 2. Interactive task - 8 minutes (including preparation time)

Students are given a task sheet with 5 - 6 prompts and each student chooses 2 or 3 they would like to talk about. Candidates are given two minutes to prepare the task and then, they are asked to discuss with their partner for approximately three minutes.

After that the examiner joins the discussion and a 3-way exchange takes place.

### Part 3. Follow-up conversation - 3 minutes

This part involves the development of a topic in a 3-way conversation. The topic is related to the general theme of the previous task.





### FINAL EXAM REMINDER

Candidates will be able to choose to sit only for Reading & Writing or for Reading & Writing and Speaking & Listening. In this case they get two different grades in their certificate.

The listening paper is on the same day of the Reading & Writing paper.

# **OXFORD HOUSE PRELIMINARY - SAMPLE PAPER**

Part 1 3 minutes

"Here you are" (Interlocutor hands in the task sheet, paper and pencil.)

TASK: You are going to talk about different ways to learn a second language.

Use the following ideas to help you. You may add any other ideas of your own.

### WAYS OF LEARNING A SECOND LANGUAGE


- Attending a course in your country

- In your opinion, is making a lot of money more important than enjoying your job?
- How useful is learning a English to communicate with people from foreign countries?
- Do you use English outside the classroom? What for?

Do contact us if you have any doubt or need our assistance. We will be more than happy to help you.



# **Alike**

Stop the film at regular intervals to analyse the characters' feelings and how these change throughout the film.

# ODE TO JOY



- 1. Tell students that you are going to test their powers of observation.
- 2. Tell them that they are going to see a video clip. Ask them to pay close attention to the details.
- 3. Play the clip once.
- 4. Ask students if they can recall the objects that they saw in the clip.
- 5. Write these on the board:

Beaker (the name of the Muppet)

A violin

A drum (or timpani)

A metronome

A glass of water

A lamp

6. Draw a grid on the board like this:

1	2	3
4	5	6

7. Use the grid to teach the following phrases:

"The top left square"

"The bottom left square"

"The bottom middle square"


"The top middle square"

"The bottom right square"

"The top right square"

- 8. To do this, start by calling out phrases and asking individual students to identify the corresponding square numbers. Later, reverse the process call out square numbers and ask individuals to identify them using the phrases.
- 9. Ask students if they would like to see the clip one more time before the observation test (they will almost certainly say yes).

10. Tell your students that you are going to write some sentences on the board. Tell them that some are true and some are false. If a student thinks that a sentence is true, he/she should copy it exactly as it is. If on the other hand the student thinks it is false, he/she should amend it accordingly. Demonstrate with the following example:




11. Write the following sentences on the board for your students to copy and amend:

- \* Beaker first appears in the top middle square.
- \* He is wearing a shirt, a tie and a light brown coat.
- \* He doesn't have ears.
- \* He drinks from the glass of water.
- \* He plays the drum in the bottom right square.
- \* He plays the violin in the top right square.
- After the glass smashes, the music starts to get faster.
- \* The metronome catches fire.
- \* Beaker falls over when he gets hit on the head by a flying lamp.
- \* Beaker gets an electric shock in the bottom middle square.
- 12. Let students pair up and compare their answers before doing feedback, paying attention to grammar and vocabulary.
- 13. Play the clip again and find out who got the most sentences right.

# 2 BOARD GAMES that work well with children and teens



This is an excellent game for students to practice using English vocabulary productively and creatively in sentences. The teacher may wish to begin the game by reviewing difficult vocabulary. The teacher can also ask the students to provide some example sentences that one might use in the game before beginning.




