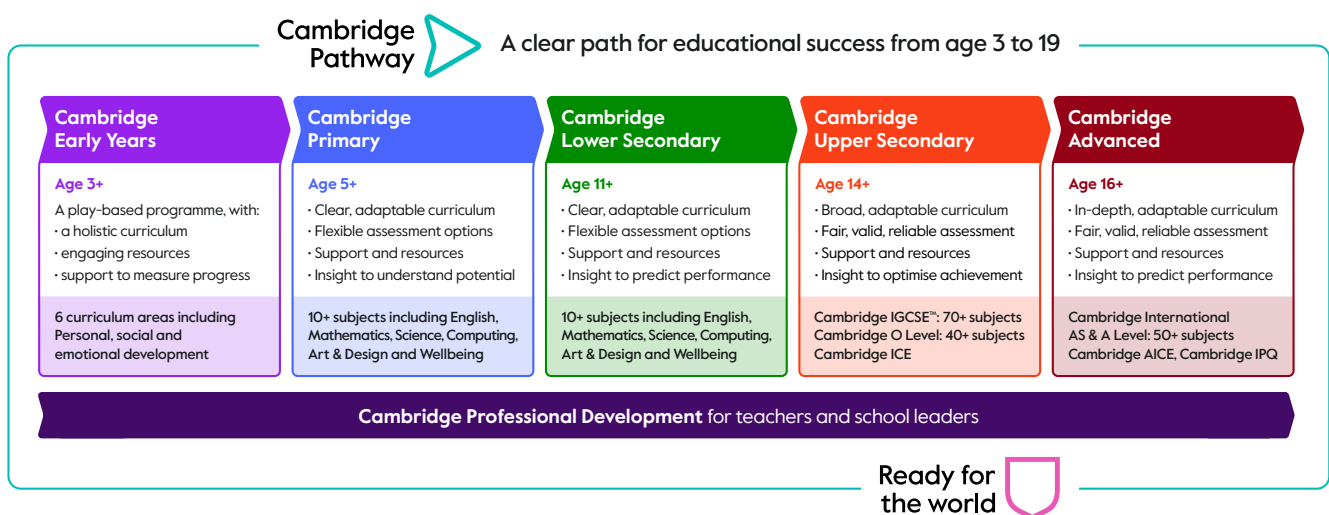

Learners receive awards if they have attained the highest marks in a subject, providing that they have achieved the minimum grade and standard mark for that award category.

'High Achievement' is awarded to learners who have achieved outstanding results in subjects which are not so widely taken and which, under the current criteria, would not qualify for 'Top in Uruguay'.
